3rd place: **Aissatou Rasa**, violin, 11thgrde at BTWHS Haydn, Violin Concerto No. 1 in C major, 1st Movement. Allegro Moderato Honorable Mention: **Morgan Lee**, bass, 12th grade at Bishop Dunne HS.

Janet Friedlander graduated from Oberlin Conservatory in 1975 and was hired by the Dallas Symphony Orchestra upon graduation in 1975. She died of cancer at the age of 33 in 1989. She was beloved by all who knew her. The DSO established this competition and scholarship fund in memory and honor of her. Rebecca Todd is the 2024 Janet Friedlander Competition Chair.
